## KINDY

Term 4 has been a busy one for home visits, with trips to Leigh Creek, Mount Sarah, Siam, Wooltana and Sturt Vale.

This term home visits were based around sensory learning experiences such as clean mud, water play, small worlds, water beads, sound, construction, slime, bubbles and puzzles.

Sensory play provides exploration, experimentation, inquiry, hypothesising, curiosity, problem solving and creativity. Building nerve connections - neuropathways, in the brain and encouraging the development of language, motor skills, mathematical concepts and emotional regulation.

Children have continued their learning journey through the following topics – transport, reptiles, opposites, personal and water safety, pirates and of course Christmas celebrations.

Transition sessions to Reception with Miss Emma have been held in preparation for children to begin school next year with School of the Air.

Pre-entry sessions have also been held for the children entering the Preschool program in 2023.

For the grand finale there will be a splash day held at the Quorn pool to celebrate children's participation in the RICE Preschool Program.

The Playday team wish everyone a Happy Christmas!







## Nutella twist Christmas tree

#### **DIRECTIONS:**

STEP 1:

Preheat oven to 180c. Place both sheets of puff pastry on top of each other, cut a tree shape through both sheets.

2 sheets puff pastry 2 tbs Nutella 1 egg - lightly beaten

#### STEP 2:

Peel the top sheet off and set aside. Spread the bottom sheet with nutella, leaving space along the edges so it doesn't get too messy when you're twisting it later. Place the second sheet of pastry back on top.


#### STEP 3:

Gently score up the centre of the tree for a guide and cut horizontally through both sheets to create branches for your tree.

#### STEP 4:

Twist each 'branch' of the tree and brush the pastry with the egg. Place in the oven and cook until golden brown. Decorate with raspberries, or icing sugar.
